Year 2 began their new topic, Muck, Mess and Mixtures with a messy morning. The children rotated around different messy stations that had activities such as magic mud pie making, bubble painting, fizzing potions, clay, shaving foam and foot painting. We had lots of fun while getting

Year 3

Year 3 had an amazing time when the Zoo Lab came to visit. As we were going to learn about different predators, Zoo Lab came to school and we got to meet 6 different creatures from all around the world. We even got to touch and hold them. It was fantastic. Year 4

Year 4 were visited by Bodvar, a real Viking warrior! He taught us all about the Vikings – where they came from, how they lived and what they believed. Year 5


In Year 5, our topic this half term was Time Traveller. During the first week of term, we had a special visit from Mrs Neal, her mum and step-dad, her teenage daughter (13) and her baby daughter (18 months). The children had the opportunity to explore the lives and experiences of the different generations by asking thoughtful questions. The children were intrigued when learning about how school life and technology has changed. Also they discovered the roles, responsibilities and pressures of parents and grandparents.

Throughout this half term we have been travelling through time, exploring different stages throughout history and their impact on modern society. We have also been learning about human changes throughout our lives.



Year 6

For our memorable experience this half term, children have had the chance to dissect a whole heart! The Year 6 Team sourced a number of sheep's hearts for groups to handle and dissect (with adult supervision). They were challenged to identify the external features including the major blood vessels such as the aorta and vena cava. They then looked at how blood flows through the heart by pouring coloured liquid into the vessels one at a time, noting which vessel the liquid appeared out of. The children sliced the heart carefully to reveal the internal features including the atria, ventricles, valves and the cord-like chordae tendineae, or heart strings. It was a very messy
