


Mount Pleasant Primary School Parent Newsletter – Issue 17 29 March 2018

Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a very cold half term with the 'Beast from the East' bringing unusual amounts of snow, resulting in some school closure days. I wanted to start this newsletter by explaining that closing the school is never an easy call to make, as a number of different factors have to be considered before a final decision is made. The two days when we had a late start was to allow our staff who travel long distances the chance to arrive safely at work, through the traffic disruptions. Parents also appreciated the late opening times so they could bring their children into school when the roads began to clear. I would like to thank all our parents who have been very supportive and understanding through these difficult few days.

New School – New External Play Spaces



When parents approach me they always have lots of questions about how the new external play spaces will be for children, once the building work is completed. I am pleased that everyone is so excited to see how the work is progressing and what we are planning. I have been working closely on this with the Chair of our Governing Body's Resources Committee, Cllr Andrew Cooper (pictured above) who is able to share that, "As Mount Pleasant Primary School is a central hub for the local community, the new external spaces are going to be a great asset for everyone. Governors are really impressed by the Head Teacher's plans and excited to see it develop into a truly amazing outdoor learning environment for the children and local families. The school's excellent achievements, results as well as the exciting new building and external developments are the main reasons why we are such a popular choice for parents, with many families appealing for places for their children."

At the recent Resources Committee meeting, we discussed and agreed key elements which will be our priority as part of the new build contract as well as some follow up works that are taking place with the support of Kirklees Council, over the coming summer holiday break. I would like to share a brief outline with you now, so that you will have a glimpse of the exciting developments that are to come.

Over the coming months, we will:

- 1. Install canopies outside Nursery, Early Years and KS1
- 2. Have a brand-new sports pitch with football, netball, basketball, as well as a running track for school athletics.
- 3. Create better access arrangements for everyone to enter the school grounds from Victoria Road.
- 4. Develop the grassed area at the bottom of the KS1 playground, adjacent to Lockwood Road, which will provide a wonderful park setting for the school and local community.
- 5. Develop the fruit garden to make it into an 'edible playground' through which children can learn about growing fruits and vegetables.
- 6. Build external classrooms in the centre of the playground which will allow children to enjoy outdoor learning.

I will continue to update you on this in further newsletters.

Our parents, children and staff worked extremely hard in designing costumes for World Book Day. Each year we are amazed by the high quality and wonderful creativity of the designs. World Book day is all about appreciating and enjoying reading and I am delighted that our children love reading and are enjoying our two amazing libraries. Attendance

Attendance is currently averaging 94% compared to last year at this time when it was 95%. See brief breakdown below for your information:-

Looking at the above figures we can clearly see that children taking leave of absence has dramatically increased from last year. Can I remind all parents that leave will only ever be authorised in extreme circumstances and all unauthorised leave will be issued with a fine.

We will be holding another draw for all children with 100% attendance when we return from the Easter break, and we will announce the lucky winners of the Waterstones Book tokens in the next newsletter.

There is race on for the best class attendance in KS1. Class 1A is galloping on in front at 95% - closely being chased by classes 2A and 2B at 94%. It is also very exciting in KS2, with classes 3B, 3C, 4B, 4C, 6B all at 96% closely followed by 3A & 6A at 95%.

Good attendance promotes good health, solid friendships and an overall sense of achievement and wellbeing for all children. Parents please consider your child's education, continuity and wellbeing when you make decisions about taking them out of school. It is their future in your hands!

Over the coming year, we will be arranging another VLE workshop to help parents with accessing the VLE and the booking system. If you do have any issues, you can see Mr Stretton after school who will be happy to show you how to use the VLE.

Messages from the Office

Dinner money: Kirklees Council request that dinner money must be paid in advance, and dinner accounts must be kept in credit. Debit balances will eventually be passed onto Kirklees if, after several reminders from the office, these are not bought into credit. If your child decides to change from dinners to sandwiches, or vice versa, please inform the office. Kitchen need to order dinners and if your child changes to sandwiches, you may still be charged.

Trips/Events: The school request that all trips and events payable be paid online via ParentPay. Alternatively, letters regarding trips and events will have a barcode to pay at a PayPoint if you wish to pay via this method.

School Milk: Milk is now ordered online. The school will provide parents with a letter and leaflet of how they can order milk online at the end of each half term – this will be available for next half term

Appointments: We seem to be getting an increasing number of children leaving school for appointments. Please book dentist, doctor or other appointments outside school time.

Absence: If your child is not in school for whatever reason, please ring the office before 9.00 am.

Nut Allergies: Due to many of our children suffering from nut allergies, please do not send nuts in your child's packed lunch or as a snack.
