The Reading Cafes supports our real push on 'Reading' and provides opportunities for children to engage with books and develop a real love for reading.

Autumn/Winter

With shorter days come colder and wetter days so please ensure children are kept warm. Year 6 High School Applications

If your child is in Year 6, please ensure you apply for a place at your child's chosen high school as soon as possible. You can do this by using the information from the 'Apply On Time' leaflet sent to you in September.

The deadline is 31st October 2015. Applications sent after this date could result in your child not having a place at your chosen High School.

Attendance

Attendance for the first half of Autumn Term is off to a good start with attendance from September averaging out at 97% including EID.

Well done to all our children who returned from the summer holidays on time, only 0.12% of children took extended Leave of Absence. May I take this opportunity to remind parents that Leave of Absence will NOT be authorised and parents will be fined by Kirklees Council. If your child does not return to school within ten days he/she will be referred to the Children Missing in Education Team and steps will be taken to remove your child from Mount Pleasant School roll.

This year we are strongly focusing on punctuality, children should not be having more than 3 lates during any one term. Children who are late into class can find it very upsetting and unsettling, especially our Reception and KS1 pupils who not only have to walk through unfamiliar surroundings but are also missing valuable learning time. The attendance officer will be monitoring children who are late and will be sending weekly message updates. If your child is persistently late, you will be invited into school to discuss the reasons; with this in mind can all parents please

make an extra effort to get your child/children into school on time through their Key Stage area door.

MPPS follow Government guidelines with regard to Persistent Absent children; your child only needs to have 5 days absence (85%) to fall into the category of PA. To avoid this happening to your child we are monitoring all children's percentages, when it falls below 90%, we will write to parents to advise them. If your child's attendance does fall to 85% or below then we will be inviting parents into school to discuss the reasons/concerns with Dr Ali.

On a lighter note please see below our new and exciting attendance incentives for this coming year:

- ◆ Children with a full weeks' attendance will receive a golden ticket. The best class attendance will receive a certificate and the class will get to keep the trophy until the next week's assembly.
- ◆ Every half term the best class attendance will receive a certificate, a bun and a drink of juice.
- ◆ Every term the best class attendance will receive a certificate, and a chosen treat of pizza or ice cream.
- ◆ In December and July we will draw one lucky winner from the golden ticket box and they will win a fabulous prize of a tablet.

Just a quick update about our school's Reading Challenge. Thank you for continuously supporting your child in taking part in the reading challenge. Many children have achieved the first star award which is a book mark. Please motivate your child to progress further next term and receive a book for the class.

School Uniform

Children must wear the correct uniform to school. The school would like to remind parents that your child **MUST** wear plain black trainers or shoes.

We would also like to remind parents that the school does not allow children to wear nail polish at school.

Updated Collection Policy

We have updated the school's collection policy - the new arrangements will start after half term (from Monday 2nd November). Parents should consider the safety implications when deciding that children can go home alone or be collected by other children.

Children in Year 5 and 6 will be allowed to walk home alone. Children in Year 6 will only be able to collect children in Year 4 and 5. Older children (Year 7 and above) will be able to collect children from Reception age upwards. Teachers will be asking you to sign a permission slip regarding these arrangements.

Safeguarding at Home Time

If you are collecting a child, please take the time to ensure that the teacher or member of staff dismissing the class is aware that you are taking them. Children in Class 3A and Year 4 will line up in the playground at home time to make this process easier. Can parents and carers please make sure they leave space for the lines! Arrangements will be the same as before in other classes. If someone different from usual is collecting your child, please ring the school office by 2.45pm at the latest to ensure the message gets to the class teacher.

Governors

Firstly a very big thank you to our parent governors Mrs Nahid Arshad and Mr Zahid Iqbal for their service, commitment and time they have offered to our school as two excellent parent governors. We are very sorry to hear they will no longer be parent governors but we are sure they will continue to be actively involved in other ways.
