Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to the Christmas 2016 issue of our newsletter. We have come to the end of another fantastic and productive term in which so many exciting events have taken place for the children at Mount Pleasant. I am pleased to be able to inform you that the building work is progressing very well. Despite the many challenges from the building works since September, staff have worked extremely hard to ensure that each and every child's education remains strong and unaffected. Children have also had the opportunity to visit our building site and witness the demolition. They have also taken part in 'building workshops' delivered by our new school construction company inside the classroom.

This term we also launched our new exciting Cornerstones curriculum. We ensured that all our children were provided with exciting and 'Memorable Experiences' to engage them with their new learning. These include: Roman / Celt battle in a nearby field; an alien crash landing on the school site, Year 6 role-played the experience of WWII evacuees, and just recently we took 400 children, parents and staff to watch the Cinderella pantomime at the Lawrence Batley Theatre. This week, our youngest children delivered to the whole school and their parents a truly amazing Christmas performance called 'Shine Star, Shine!' It was wonderful to see the confidence our children had in performing in front of such large audiences. We are all so proud of them!

The greatest news I want to give you comes following the recent release of the Primary Performance League Tables as published by the Department for Education. You will be pleased to know that our school has done exceptionally well in comparison to other Kirklees schools. These truly amazing results demonstrate the commitment and passion of staff that has enabled our children to receive excellent education. They also evidence that our school is continuing to move from strength to strength. A big thank you from me, firstly to our children, and then our staff and parents who have worked so hard to make this happen. Overview of results as follows:

- Combined score for Reading, Writing and Maths 32nd School in Kirklees

The School Council are already discussing more exciting charity collection ideas for 2017.


#### **Robin Hood Pantomime**

### Year 5 Hanukkah Assembly

With the Jewish festival of lights – Hanukkah - coming up, Year 5 have been busy preparing and rehearsing their Hanukkah assembly. Hanukkah lasts for 8 days and begins on the 25th day of Kislev (a month in the Hebrew calendar).

This year, according to the western calendar, Hanukkah will begin in the evening of Saturday 24th December and will end in the evening of Sunday 1st January 2017. Using role play and singing in their assembly, children in Year 5 explained to KS1 and KS2 what Hanukkah is, when Jewish people celebrate it, and why.



### **Pupil Attendance**

Overall pupil attendance at Mount Pleasant Primary School is very good, at 96.2%.

We are very happy to announce that 68 children from Reception and KS1 and 140 children from KS2 have come to school every day since September and have achieved 100% attendance. Their efforts will be rewarded by receiving a 100% attendance certificate and in January they will be invited to a DVD and Popcorn Party.



Gentle reminder; Please only keep your children absent from school when they are really ill, we will always send a poorly child home if they are not well enough to be in school. Also, wherever possible please try and book Doctors, Dentist or any other appointments out of school time.

We have noticed an increase in the number of children coming into school late, this can be very upsetting for your child and also disruptive to the class teacher when a lesson has started. The gates are open from 8.35am and the classroom doors are open from 8.45am and close at 8.55am.

Children keep collecting your weekly merits and once you have collected 10 please see Miss Kershaw and she will reward you with a 100% attendance pencil.





### Year 4 & 5 Building Workshop

Kier Group, the construction company building our new school, delivered some educational workshops with Year 4 and Year 5 children. During the workshop, children learned about the creation of responsive and sustainable architecture. Pupils were asked to work collaboratively to make a 3-D model using only spaghetti and marshmallows; with such delicate equipment, this proved to be trickier than expected. Nevertheless, all children persevered and through trial and error they managed to create some successful models – some more complex than others!



As a result of this experience, children became aware of the hard graft and skills involved in construction, such as being imaginative, creative and resourceful. The children thoroughly enjoyed the workshop and some expressed a desire to embark on a career in construction or architecture when they are older. Moreover, they can now link this learning to what is happening on site with the new build currently under development.

#### **Memorable Experiences**

### Nursery

This term the Nursery children have been to the moon! We packed our bags, got dressed in our spacesuits and took off, 5,4,3,2,1 ....Blast off!!! We had a picnic, walked on the moon and then flew home again. We have also been making and painting rockets with shapes and bricks, and learning all about shiny things!







Reception have been learning about the Gruffalo and had a special visit from The Gruffalo and the Mouse. The children enjoyed meeting them both and were able to think of tricky questions to ask the characters. They have also written them letters.



### Year 1

Year 1 had a very exciting start to the half term. When we arrived on 1<sup>st</sup> November we noticed something strange had happened in the garden. An alien spaceship had crash landed and an alien appeared to have escaped. The police came to see what was going on and taped off the area. Each class in Year 1 turned into investigators and went to visit the site to try to find out what had happened! We realised that one of the aliens must have had an accident because there was alien blood everywhere! The children enjoyed looking into the site and working out what had been going on over the holidays. We described the alien site and thought about what our mystery visitor might have looked like. Our "Beegu" story really helped us with ideas and we got really excited about learning about spaceships.

# Year 2

The Year 2 memorable experience was a trip to Conisbrough Castle in Doncaster. We explored the keep and learnt all about where Lord Hamelin and Lady Isobel lived. We also had a classroom experience where we got to dress up as different characters such as a knight, chef, Lord and Lady.



# Year 3

For their Memorable Experience Year Three had an exciting time visiting local playgrounds. They had time to try out the equipment and think about how it all works. They found out about materials used in the playground and the forces used to make the playground fun. All of this contributed a lot to their scientific understanding.

### Year 4

Year 4 enjoyed a visit from a nutritionist Miss Waheed at the start of their teeth and digestion topic "Burps, Bottoms and Bile." She discussed the importance of keeping healthy regarding the teeth and digestive organs. The children then took part in a quiz which enabled them to become familiar with the topic words. Miss Waheed presented an engaging PowerPoint informing the children about healthy and unhealthy foods. After that, they experienced tasting fruits which have added health benefits. They were then given the opportunity to interview Miss Waheed with a question and answer session.

### Year 5



This half term, Year 5 have been exploring space through our Stargazers topic. Our memorable experience was an exciting day at Magna Science Adventure Centre, Rotherham. As well as learning about some of the main elements (fire, water, wind and earth) we had the opportunity to attend a space workshop. During this workshop we discovered some of the main stars and constellations in the night sky, the distance of each planet from the sun, life on the International Space Station, and even a demonstration of how rockets are propelled through space! The children left this experience with the zeal to explore and learn more about the universe in which we live.

# Year 6

This term in Year 6 children had their memorable experience in Manchester at the Museum of Science and Industry! During the day the children had chance to explore the Museum of Science and Industry which fitted in with our topic, the Industrial Revolution within the Victorian era. Children had the opportunity to partake in three workshops, where they learned about the textile mills; they had the opportunity to work with textile machinery, explore the machines, and also learn about Victorian stream trains and transport. It was a fantastic day out and all of the children learned many new things.

### **School Dinners**

If your child has school dinners and is in KS2, their dinner money must be paid online via ParentPay or use a PayPoint card. If you do not have a ParentPay login, the office can provide you with your login details. Dinner money must be paid in advance and be kept up to date. The school sends out reminders via text message and letters home if dinner money becomes owed.

### **Trips/visits**

These are always put on ParentPay for you to pay, however if your require a barcode letter to pay, please feel welcome to do so at the office or ask your child's class teacher.

### Flapjack

This must be paid on a half termly basis and the School Office will send out letters each term in advance for parents to pay on ParentPay.

### Milk

This is to be paid on a termly basis and the School Office will send out letters in advance for parents to pay on ParentPay.

### **Fantastic Friday**

This is a special Friday dinner for children who usually do not have a school lunch. Children in KS2 who have a packed lunch or go home for dinner can pay for a school dinner every Friday. Payment is made via ParentPay every half term. KS1 children are eligible for Universal Free School Meals, therefore they do not have to pay but if they have packed lunches or go home, then the School Office must be notified. This then allows the kitchen to have accurate numbers for catering purposes. For further details please contact the School Office.
