Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome to the Spring Half-Term Parent Newsletter, as we begin to look forward to slightly longer days and the start of warmer weather.

As you know, I always like to share news of a new exciting development in each newsletter. I previously informed you about the KS2 Library which many parents visited as part of the new school tours. Well, today's announcement is about our brand new KS1 Library which has just been completed and resourced with books by KS1 children's most favourite authors. I know how much our children love to read and I want these libraries to be the most favourite parts of the new school, for every child. I also want parents to come and make use of the libraries. We will



soon be sharing further details about how we can make this happen. Our focus through these provisions as well as through steps taken directly with pupils in the classrooms is to further improve reading and writing.

The second piece of good news is about a recent visit by the school's Kirklees Learning Partner, who is a Head Teacher herself as well as an Ofsted Inspector. She carried out a Learning Walk of the school and visited all year groups, observed teaching and learning as well as monitoring the quality of our children's books. She was very impressed with the school and noted particularly the following:

- 1. Libraries are well thought out and highly engaging learning spaces that will promote reading further,
- 2. Children have excellent behaviour and a positive attitude to learning,
- 3. Skilled teachers with excellent subject knowledge question children well to engage them and extend their learning further,
- 4. Well prepared resources which motivate and engage learning,
- 5. Well-presented children's books where it is evident they take pride in their learning.

Work on Phase 3 of the school's building site continues as we approach the end of the demolition works. Once completed, Kier (building contractors) will start on preparing the school's vast new playing grounds and sports pitch. I am currently working with the Government's Education Funding Agency, Kier and the Local Council to discuss ways through which we can maximise the use and effectiveness of the play spaces for our children. Phase 3 works are going to schedule and we are confident that the whole site will be ours again before children return from their summer holidays to school in September.

Based on this timetable, I am planning a Grand Opening Ceremony in early September to celebrate the full completion of works. I will share further details of this in due course so that you can make a note in your

diary and join in to make these celebrations a whole community event.

Responsibilities

Although the school gates open at 8:30am and children in Years 5 and 6 (with parental consent) are able to come to school by themselves, the school cannot take responsibility for any child until the school doors open at 8:40am (with the exception of Nursery and children who attend Breakfast Club). Parents are responsible for their children until 8:40am.

We would also like to request that parent dropping and picking children up park safely and appropriately. Parents are parking on the coned areas, which is making it unsafe for children and parents who go home walking.

Messages from the Office

Dinner money: Kirklees Council request that dinner money must be paid in advance and dinner accounts must be kept in credit. Debit balances will eventually be passed onto Kirklees if after several reminders from the office, if these are not bought into credit. If your child decides to change from dinners to sandwiches, or vice versa, please inform the office. Kitchen need to order dinners and if your child changes to sandwiches, you may still be charged.

Trips/Events: The school request that all trips and events payable be paid online via ParentPay. Alternatively, letters regarding trips and events will have a barcode to pay at a PayPoint on them if you wish to pay via this method.

School Milk: Milk is now ordered online. The school will provide parents with a letter and leaflet of how they can order milk online at the end of each half term – this will be available for next half term.

Appointments: We seem to be getting an increasing number of children leaving school for appointments. Please book dentist, doctor or other appointments outside school time.

Absence: If your child is not in school for whatever reason, please ring the office first thing.

Nut Allergies: Due to many of our children suffering from nut allergies, please do not send nuts in your child's packed lunch or as a snack.

Year 3


During our topic of 'Mighty Metals' we have explored the world of forces, magnets, metals and materials.

This has lead us on a journey to investigate the different forces which are applied to objects, how magnets attract and repel and which materials cause the most friction!



Year 4

In year 4 enjoyed a visit to Blue Planet Aquarium in Cheshire. There was a huge tank that had lots of fish, including sharks and ray fish. We listened to a talk about them. They all had names and we saw two divers feed the ray fish. One of the most exciting parts of the day was when we went through the tunnel. We travelled along a moving floor. It felt like we were under the water with the animals. The fish were swimming around us and over our heads. We went into different zones where we saw and learnt about all kinds of sea creatures, big and small, plain and colourful. They were all amazing.





Year 5



For our memorable experience, the year 5 children witnessed the ancient Egyptian mummification process, including the removal of the organs such as the liver and intestines – children particularly enjoyed watching the brain being pulled out through the nose with a hook. After the experience, children wrote their own set of instructions on how to embalm a dead body the Egyptian way.

Year 6

Our topic was Frozen Kingdom. To immerse the children into the topic, we had icebergs for the children to observe. The icebergs were left in water all day to see what happened to them. We used salt and food colouring to see what would happen. During the afternoon, we carried out research to help us write an information leaflet about icebergs.

Our current overall attendance is 95%.

Extended Leave

We have received an extremely high number of applications for leave of absence since September; we have also noticed an increase in the number of days/weeks families are requesting. Please be aware that any request over 5 days is an automatic fine. This is set by the Government; the school does not benefit from prosecuting families and all the money that is collected from the fines goes directly to the Local Authority (Kirklees Council). We ask you to seriously consider any term time leave of absence very carefully and speak with the Head Teacher before booking any flights. If you have no option but to take your child on an extended leave, we ask that you make any bookings alongside a school holiday and take the least number of days, thereby minimising the risk of your child falling into the category of being Persistent Absence. This is a category set by the Government for any child whose attendance causes concerns and falls below 90%.

Please note: We now have many year groups where we have children on the waiting list for place at our school. Therefore, if you take your child on an extended leave and do not return on your stated date, we will have no option but to remove your child's name from the school register and offer this place to the first child on the waiting list.

Medical Appointments

I have noticed that quite a few absences have been due to all day medical appointments. In order for the school to authorise any medical appointments you will need to provide proof of the appointment. If your child has a routine doctor/dentist appointment, this has to be booked out of school hours. If it is an urgent appointment and has to be arranged during the school day we would request that you book it at the beginning or the end of the day to minimise disruption to your child's learning. If your child has to go out of school for an appointment we would always expect them to return as quickly as possible.

Lates

Children are still arriving late into school via the office. Please remember that our school gates open at 8.30am with the school doors opening at 8:40am (Nursery 8:30am) and close at 8:50am promptly. Registration closes at 8:55am. Please make every effort to ensure your child comes to school on time.

British Red Cross Workshops



British Red Cross will be delivering sessions to Year 5 and Year 6 classes during February and March. These sessions are about refugee awareness and stigmatising behaviour. These sessions will also enable children how to challenge stereotypes and media influence.

Reading Friends

Reading Friends training will be taking place in school after the half-term holiday. Numerous parents have already responded to class teacher's enquiries, so there are just a few places remaining. If you are interested either speak to your class teacher, or leave a message for Mrs. House at the office.

The training will be delivered by a Kirklees Authority qualified trainer. Applicants must attend 4 sessions – Mondays 9.00am - 12.00noon - 5th / 12th / 19th 26th March 2018. Following this each of the trainees will voluntarily work within school – 1 hour per week (Tuesday morning 9.00am - 12.00noon) and will spend time reading with two children. This reading support would then be expected to take place until the end of the Summer term.

This is a really good opportunity to build your own confidence and find out about working in a school environment. It will also prove to be an extremely beneficial scheme for some of our children.

Training

We have an external provider offering some training after the half-term holidays. This training, for community members, will include – some basic First Aid Awareness / Behaviour Management strategies / Healthy eating and other elements. This training will take place over 5 x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour sessions.
