Dear Parents / Carers,

We have finally made it to the end of another unusual year!

I am so proud of the way everyone has handled the pandemic situation and remained positive despite all the challenges. To recap on this unusual year: in the autumn term, we all had to adjust to the school's risk assessment in line with government policy for managing the virus. A main change for parents meant they were unable to come into classes as they were used to doing. Children and staff also had to adapt to the many, changes, the main one being working in their consistent class bubble and having staggered lunches and break times. Whilst we were quite fortunate in the first half term, in the second, as virus rates increased, we had to close some bubbles and manage online learning. #### Notes from the Office

- Please note that school meals will be increasing to £2.35 per day from the start of the Autumn Term, 6<sup>th</sup> September, 2021.
- Reminder: From Year 3 all children (unless they are on benefits related free school meals) need to pay for their school meals. Universal Free School Meals only applies up to Year 2. So if your child is moving up to Year 3 in September you will need to ensure there is sufficient money in your parent pay account in advance to pay for their school meals. This will be £11.75 per week.
- Please can parents make sure that all children's school clothes / belongings are marked clearly with their full name. We will then be able to return all found items to their rightful owners.
