I would like to take the opportunity in this newsletter to share with you some of the wonderful work our many young leaders in the school are taking part in. Firstly, the **School Council** - as you will be aware from previous newsletters, has been working really hard with their fund raising efforts both for charities and for rewards for our own children. With the latest fund raising, they managed to raise enough money to purchase a Play-Station 4. This prize was revealed during one of our Celebration Assemblies and all the children were extremely excited to have such a wonderful prize. Mrs Saddiq has started to run lunch time clubs which allows children who have been chosen in the Golden Book to play along with their friends on the play-station.





The **Be-friender** project is well

established within the school and has been running for many years. The project encourages children to be supportive of each other within the school and reinforces the work that is already taking place to provide the pupils with a caring environment where they feel happy and safe to learn. The children chosen in Year 6 have been trained in the following: active listening, confidence building, gaining responsibilities within the school, and improving communication skills. Once children have been trained, through discussions; learning the Be-friender promise; rules of confidentiality and role-play. They are then empowered to

support children independently, with day to day problems, worries or concerns they have in and out of school. This project has been very successful over the years; children and visitors of the school have commented positively on how well our children are able to resolve problems in school.

Our **Play Leaders** are a group of trained children who set activities for the younger children every lunch time. The younger children respond well to the Play Leaders and enjoy the many games which they organise. This has built up good leadership skills for these Year 4 children. A big well done to them!

Members of the Kirklees PREVENT team have recently visited our school and presented information to the children regarding the dangers of using on-line apparatus without adequate adult supervision.

We were made aware of the numbers of pupils who are accessing inappropriate gaming platforms, leaving them very vulnerable to 'interference' from unknown sources. 12+ age guidance is applied to these 'games' due to the level of violence or other material which is considered unsuitable for younger children. We are appealing to parents to take the initiative, stop this trend and prevent children from viewing the same images and material as older family members/friends. We are always very pleased to see the large number of parents who support children and our school by attending school events. Children are always very proud and pleased when they see their family members in the audience. Recently, however, we have noticed that some families are arriving late to events and this has caused disruptions - this is a reminder that we expect everyone **to arrive on time** to school events. This will support all children, who as you can appreciate can become nervous when performing in front of large audiences. We must all do whatever we can to support children to remain calm and focussed. I am sure all parents will appreciate why we are having to put this system into place.

Attendance

Please see listed below our latest Attendance figures;

95.3% - current attendance

3.47% is authorised absence, (illness)

1.23% is unauthorised absence (including unauthorised leave of absence)

There is currently a high number of children absent from school for various illnesses and extended leave. All absences have an effect on our figures, we therefore encourage all our families to support our fabulous school to raise our overall attendance and reach our overall target of 97%.

Because we currently have children on our waiting list requiring school places, any requests for leave over 10 days will be followed up with a referral to the Kirklees APSO Service and procedures will be followed to have your child/children removed from our school roll and their place will be offered to another child.

If your child's attendance is under 95%, they are missing at least TWO WEEKS of learning time in a year, and at 90% they are missing FOUR WEEKS. This will significantly affect their work and reduce their grades – SCHOOL ATTENDANCE MATTERS!
