Dear Parents/Carers,

Firstly, I would just like to say that on a very positive note, Covid positive cases have significantly reduced, compared to the start of the term, when we had many staff and children testing positive. Thank you to all the parents who followed Government and school expectations through reporting positive cases and keeping children isolated for the required times.

We always value parental feedback and have done this in many ways over the years to gauge how parents view our school, and most importantly if there are any next steps we can take to make our school even better. Parents were extremely positive about the school, with the majority, over 90%, reporting positively on the following:

- My child is happy at this school.
- My child is safe at this school
- The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.

The majority of parents also agreed, that if any bullying did happen in the school, the staff dealt with it quickly.

With regards to how children are doing in school, parents were again very positive (over 90%) that they were kept well informed of their children's next steps. As you are aware, we do this through parent informal discussions with the teachers at the two parents' evenings and the annual school report. Parents also reported confidently that they knew what their child will be learning; this mainly happens through the half-termly Parent Curriculum Newsletters, and information is also shared on the school website.

Parents of children with special needs and disabilities also reported that their child was making good progress in the school.

The final question related to whether parents had confidence to recommend our school to other families; again, parents (over 90%) responded positively to this. We also know from conversations with parents that they talk to their family and friends about how great our school is. Parents who bring their children to our school from other schools, also comment how string the quality of education is at our school. As a result, we have for the first time in many years been completely full, with waiting lists in most year groups.

For some of the questions, we did have some parents who chose 'I do not know' and I would like to use this opportunity to explain what we are doing, in particular for our new families.

There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.	We ensure that all areas of learning in the EYFS and subjects in the National Curriculum are followed, so all children receive a broad, rich and balanced school curriculum. Please see the school website under Curriculum for further information. The Parent Curriculum Newsletters also provide a lot of information on what the children will be learning each half term.
My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school	During the last two years we stopped after school clubs whilst we managed bubbles and covid. However, this year we have restarted after school clubs, and we hope to do even more in the future.

Once again, thank you to all parents who contributed to the questionnaire. It was lovely to receive such positive feedback. Please do continue to spend a few minutes of your time completing such questionnaires in the future as well, as we do like to have as much parental feedback as possible.

I hope everyone has a lovely half term holiday and I look forward to seeing everyone back again on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> February.

This demonstrated how difficult it is for sea life creatures which get caught in plastic pollution. Children then thought about solutions to these problems. After having lunch, the children walked around in groups to see all the wonderful creatures living in the aquarium, such as: sea turtles, sharks, jellyfish and even piranhas!







## Year 5 Memorable Experience

Year 5 have been learning about our local history. We have studied old photographs and maps of Lockwood and compared them to how we see Lockwood today. We investigated technology from the past and identified their modern counterparts. Our memorable experience took us to the Tolson Museum to see images and artifacts from Lockwood's past.







### Year 6 Memorable Experience

This half term, Year 6 have been looking at WW2 and the Holocaust. To help deepen children's understanding we visited the Holocaust exhibit at the University of Huddersfield.

Children were able to see poignant personal photos of survivors from the Holocaust and their families and their original artefacts and documents, together with an original prisoner uniform.

Through the artifacts, survivors told their stories of discrimination, persecution, escape, forced labour, concentration camps and liberation.

The children really valued the experience.
